

September 24, 2021 Notes Fire Safe Council Meeting:

A sign in sheet was passed around.

There was the usual rumor control on what was going on around the community.

There was an update to the map that was shared with everyone, Adrian added the agriculture land to the map.

Discussed next meeting schedules. There will be an **October meeting on the 28th, 2021**. The November meeting is the week of thanksgiving, and the December meeting is the week of Christmas. The January meeting will be **Thursday Jan. 27, 2022**. The discussion for the November meeting was to hold an open house as part of the process for the CWPP and Debbie is going to contact Eric Knapp (a FS research from Redding who does fuels treatments research) and see if he can come give a talk in November. Date will be determined by his availability. Stay tuned. December meeting is a potential Christmas gathering with the group from Soldier Mtn. Fire department – update will be coming on that idea also.

The tax code update that Debbie found was passed out to members of the fire safe council.

Debbie passed around a copy of the draft of the CWPP for the members to look at.

The rest of the meeting was spent working on a system to prioritize treatments. For the first attempt it would be a simple yes/no system. If you answered yes to a question it would be one point, no to a question zero points. An example of how this would work is below with the categories/questions. I used our property, Ray's on Old School Road and Chris's on Gomez road as examples.

1. Is the landowner willing to fund part of the work – match potential.
2. Landowner willing to let the work happen
3. Adjacent to a completed project
4. Treatment costs/treatment methods **(we need to work on this – at the next meeting)**
5. CEQA does it require a forest management plan (this also needs some work at the next meeting)

6. Collaboration/community involvement

7. Treatment effectiveness and sustainability

8. Fire environment – past fire history of the area, response time, population density

After making this example, at the next meeting we are going to have to work on this some more.
